Belief in angels.3. Belief in the holy books.4. Belief in the prophets and that Muhammad was the final prophet.5. Belief in the Day of Judgement (the day when Allah decides if a person goes to heaven or hell).6. Belief in predestination (the belief that Allah has already planned out what will happen).As well as the six main beliefs, there are Five Pillars of Islam. Shahadah: Muslims say a declaration of faith. Salah: Muslims pray five times a day. Before prayer, they must wash themselves and then face Mecca whilst praying. Zakat: Muslims must donate to charities. Sawm: Muslims fast for one month during a time called Ramadan. Hajj: Muslims have to travel to Mecca once in their lifetime, if they can afford to.
