Dear Parents,

Thank you for your edible contributions which made a wonderful display for our harvest festival this morning. We also had some home grown produce from our school harvest including tomatoes, runner beans, lettuce and herbs

Thank you also to the volunteers/representatives of the Salvation Army who came along to talk to the children about homelessness, poverty and hunger here in Wirral. They will pack up the food donated and distribute it all locally. Have a look at the photographs on our website gallery.

Beginning and end of the school day

Last month we set out the changes we were making to try to ease congestion at the beginning and end of the day.

The mornings seem to be smoother and the children are coming calmly into school once the whistle has blown at 8.50am.

We are aware there are still difficulties at the end of the day with congestion around the blue fence and bike sheds and ask you all to help us with this whilst we explore more permanent improvements.

Parents of children in Foundation Stage need to get through the same blue gates that Key Stage 1 children come out through. Key Stage 1 parents need to be able to see their children before staff let them go. Some of our Key Stage 2 pupils need to come out past the Bike sheds and collect their bikes. Please be considerate of each other and make sure you are not blocking these routes.

May we politely remind you that once staff have handed over the children to you, they are your responsibility. We sometimes spot children leaving the premises on their own – and of course will bring them back inside. However, the children at this point are not our responsibility and we are not always there...

Just a reminder that we do not tolerate abuse which includes shouting at members of our staff. This is unacceptable and sets a very poor example to children. If you are upset then come inside and speak with us so we can try to resolve any problems in a calm adult manner.

Curriculum Information and Home learning

Topics for this term are:-

EYFS: Journeys KS1: Food and Me KS2: World War One

KS2 pupils studied this topic two years ago, but this time have a different focus. We are hoping to collate a book of stories of experiences of world war one from within our school community. Although it is unlikely, this is within anyone's living memory, there may be older family members who recall being told of events by their parents or grandparents. We would welcome any contributions written by adults or children - or written together which children could bring into school to share this term...

Keeping children safe

You may be aware of a couple of incidents in Wirral recently where children have been approached by strangers. We have reminded our older pupils to be wary and to shout loudly for help if they ever feel threatened.

Safety online: Following on from last month, below is a link where parents can sign up to receive information about new social networks and Apps that children may be using. There are also links to information about Parental Controls and tips about talking to children about how to stay safe online: https://www.net-aware.org.uk/

One of our parents has informed us that it is possible to book an appointment on line to go into an Apple store and staff will synchronise devices to allow any child's device to be linked to yours so that you can see exactly where they are going and what they are doing on line. You can set controls e.g. to prevent the child directly downloading any new Apps (has to go through you). If your child protests about their right to privacy, it is the ideal moment to teach them that nothing they do or say online is private and could end up anywhere - even if it only appears for 10 seconds! Just as we accompany and supervise younger children out and about and just as we ask them where they are going, who they are with and what they are up to once they are old enough to go out without us, keeping an eye on what they are up to online is our responsibility as parents to ensure that they are safe.

Turning on Safety mode in YouTube on a computer/ tablet/phone will help filter videos that may be inappropriate for children and will also activate SafeSearch in Google. Click here to find out how: http://www.real.com/resources/youtube-parental-controls/

It is also possible to set different profiles for users of different ages on the same device. Note that most devices will default to factory settings after updates so you will need to repeat the process periodically.
