To continue to develop independence when putting on own coats.

To begin to show control in holding and using mark making tools

To begin to use one handed tools and equipment such as using la paintbrush and making snips in paper using scissors.

To begin to draw lines and circles using large movements, using chalks, large paintbrushes, ribbons in the air.

Maths

Number

To continue to subitise numbers to 3 and beyond in different contexts and different arrangements. To continue reciting some numbers in sequence. To begin to represent numbers using fingers To begin to realise not only objects but anything can be counted e.g claps, jumps, stamps.

Shape Space and Measure

To begin to notice simple shapes in pictures.

To continue to understand and use some time vocabulary such as soon, before or later in relation to everyday discussions such as sharing news and discussing the sequence of the day.

Expressive Arts & Design

To explore a range of musical instruments and to copy a beat.

To begin exploring light and dark colours when painting.

To begin to use a range of media and materials to create pictures, patterns.
