rainforest	A dense forest, normally found in tropical areas with high rainfall.
deforestation	The action of clearing a wide area of trees.
indigenous	the first people to live in a place
logging	trees are cut down for timber, which is sold to other countries
farming	Land is cleared and planted with cash crops, such as palm oil.
settlement	a place, typically one which has previously been uninhabited, where people establish a community.
dam	a barrier constructed to hold back water.
fuel	material such as coal, gas, or oil that is burned to produce heat or power
erosion	which earthen materials are worn away and transported by natural forces such as wind or water
agriculture	farming the soil for crops
ranching	breeding cattle
mining	obtaining coal or other minerals from a mine

Did you know...

- ...rainforests cover approximately 6% of the Earth's surface but contain more than $\frac{1}{2}$ of the world's plants? About 90% of organisms are found in the canopy.
- ...that there are two types of rainforests Tropical and Temperate? Tropical rainforests are generally warmer than temperate ones.
- ...many things we have in our homes come from rainforests including: chocolate, sugar, rubber, bamboo and many medicines?
