Yesterday, our school cook Louise talked to all of our Key Stage 2 children about how she follows the government guidelines for healthy eating whilst still providing a menu chosen by the children. We also ask that you save nut products (including peanut butter and Nutella) for home as we have a few children with severe nut allergies.
