Go to www.bing.com and search for 'typing test'. Or just [click here](#). To try the 1 minute speed test, just start typing in the box which says, 'Type here to start the test.' Have a few attempts and send your best score to your teacher on the VLE. If you have to look at the keys or if you are only using some of your fingers, then go back to [Level 1 on DanceMatTyping](#) and work on this. If you learn correct finger placement now, you will keep getting faster and faster. If you use the wrong fingers now, you will hit a certain speed and not be able to progress past it.
