- The World's most expensive car was so rare and special that it cost over \$48 million in an auction.



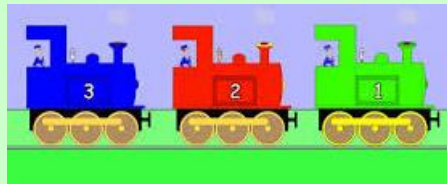
