### Link Governors...

In recent letters we have been hearing about the roles of our Link Governors. This week, our wellbeing Link Governor, Bryn Williams has taken the opportunity to explain his role to you.

One of the roles of the school governors is to monitor how the school is progressing towards its agreed educational goals. To fulfil this objective, we have to monitor all aspects of school life and to do this effectively we choose Link Governor roles where we each have responsibilities to scrutinise particular areas of the school and report our findings back to the full governing body. In turn, this allows us to talk to Mrs Bailey and her team in a careful balancing act where we are both supportive, yet also ready to challenge and ask tough questions if progress is not as expected.

My Link Governor role is the wellbeing of pupils and staff. My monitoring process involves a range of duties, including: perusing the wellbeing policies; questioning Mr Procter (our Wellbeing Lead) about the policies and the ways that pupil and staff wellbeing is supported; analysing all the information available that will allow me to understand the success (or otherwise) of the policies; and also speaking to staff and seeing the pupil activities used to promote wellbeing, such as topics in PSHE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic education), My Huge Bag of Worries, Wellbeing Ambassadors, Self-Care Wheels, Wellbeing week, Play Makers, guided breathing and calming techniques. An impressive list, which sounds good - but is that it? Something that sounds good? I needed some expert help to make things clear - my Year 6 daughter. The way she was able to fluently articulate how wellbeing was addressed at school was a very persuasive piece of evidence supporting the effectiveness of the West Kirby Primary School wellbeing strategy.

I would encourage anyone interested in the development of young people in our community to consider becoming a Governor. Like anything worthwhile, it requires some time and effort but, in return, you will quickly learn a lot about how education works and about the effectiveness of this school.

What have I learnt in particular? I have learnt that West Kirby Primary School is a very positive and happy place for both staff and students and I have learnt that the leadership team and all the staff here never settle - there is a culture of innovation driven by a desire for continuous improvement in supporting the growth and education of all the unique children who have the good fortune to attend the West Kirby Primary School.
