### Thank You ...

Thank you for your patience and understanding last week as we re-opened on Wednesday to Vulnerable and Critical Worker children. We hope that the children at home are continuing to enjoy and engage in our Remote Learning Provision. It has been amazing to see how well the children have adapted. Staff have been really pleased with the quality and creativity of the work that has been submitted. We appreciate that this is a big change for everyone and understand there is a lot of work for the children to complete each day, especially when you have more than one child to cater for. However, it is important that as a school we continue to provide what the Government has instructed us to do. We just ask that you support your child/children to access what they can and build upon this as you settle into new routines.

## Feedback...

At present we have had to amend the amount of written feedback that we provide the children, this is due to the reduced availability of our staff. We recognise the importance of individual feedback and appreciate the positive impact it has on children's learning and motivation. As soon as we are able to increase the individual written feedback we will. Please continue to support your child to submit the work that they are asked to via the VLE each day.

### Live Lessons...

English and Maths Live Teams meetings will continue to be delivered by teachers this week. These links will be sent to you in advance for these lessons. At present, we are unable to resume the additional Live Teams meetings in the afternoon for foundation subjects. However, all of the resources that the children need for these lessons will be uploaded daily on the VLE. Please continue to support your child/children to engage in these lessons as part of their Remote Learning timetable.

There will be Live Storytime sessions for EYFS children on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons.

## Teams Chat...

Please can we ask you to remind your child/children that the chat facility on the Live Teams meeting is to be used for specific purposes. This is likely to be to type in their name when they log in to show that they are present and to give a response to the teacher when they are asked a question. Thank you for your continued support.

#### Teams Rules....

The rules for Teams meetings are displayed at the beginning of live lessons for KS1 & 2 and cover things such as:

Aiming to join meetings on time each day

Being appropriately dressed for meetings

Keeping the microphone on mute unless asked to unmute

Using the hands up facility to ask a question

Only using the chat facility when asked to do so

Please can we ask you to support your child/children to remember and continue to follow these rules.
