NSPCC Number Day...

Thank you for your support with Number Day today, it was great to see so many children displaying/wearing numbers. As well as promoting the importance of Maths, it has also been a great opportunity to raise money for the NSPCC.

Parents Evening & Reports...

Parent's Evening has taken place this week and it has been an opportunity for you to talk to your child's class teacher after what has been a very different academic year. It has been a long time since our last Parent's Evening in the autumn term. Hopefully from talking with class teachers and receiving the spring interim reports you feel informed and up to date.

If you have not managed to have Parent's Evening with your child's class teacher, please can I urge you to contact the school office as soon as possible so that a convenient time can be made in the next week or so. We appreciate that we are operating in a different way at the moment by using Teams to conduct our meetings. However, please do not let this put you off as we can work around this and/or support you if you are unsure how to access the meetings – just ask! To ensure the best for your child it is really important that we have that communication with parents and carers.

You will receive your child's final report for this academic year in July.

Morning Drop off...

Please can I remind you to ensure that your child is on time to school each day. Lessons start straight away when the class bubbles open. At the start of the day class teachers outline the school day along with any changes that are taking place. It is really important that all children are present so that they have a settling start to the school day.

- Year 3 and Year 4 start school at 8:45am
- Year 1 and Year 2 start school at 9:00am
- F1 and F2 start school at 9:15am

If your child arrives past the start time of their class bubble and the doors that they enter school through are closed, please go around to the school office. Please do not knock on classroom doors, as lessons will have already started.

Swimming...

These are the positive words of some of the children in Year 5 (Class 5). Last week they went swimming and had a great time. It was all really well organised by The Concourse and Edsential to ensure that a Covid secure environment was in place.

Due to the Covid Pandemic children have missed out on many activities that they would normally do after school and at weekends and swimming is definitely one of them. Some local leisure centres are now operating limited services, one of which is swimming lessons for children. Some of you may have seen the news this week that we are being urged to prioritise swimming lessons both in school and out of school, as swimming has many physical and mental health benefits. Living near the beach in West Kirby makes it even more important to ensure that children can swim and know how to stay safe in and near water. If you are able to enrol your child on swimming lessons, please do pursue this opportunity.

Year 5 Secondary Transfer...

Earlier this week Year 5 Parents & Carers should have received an email with information about Assessment for Grammar School. If you wish for your child to be assessed for a non-Catholic Grammar School education, you must register them by **31**st **May.** If you are unable to register online, you can obtain paper forms by calling the Call Centre on 0151 606 2000. Parents who do not wish their child to be assessed for a Grammar School do not need to register. Upton Hall School (FJC), St Anselm's College and Birkenhead High School Academy have their own testing arrangements and should be contacted by parents directly for more details. This week a Web Based Chat Service called **<u>Omegle</u>** was brought to our attention. Reports of Omegle have featured in recent press releases, which I wanted to draw your attention to.

'Omegle links up random people for virtual video and text chats, and claims to be moderated - but has a reputation for unpredictable and shocking content.

Global child protection groups are increasingly concerned about predators using the site to gather selfgenerated child sexual abuse material.' (BBC News)

We are aware that some children in UKS2 know about this website. It is really important that we all stay vigilant about what the children are accessing when on the internet.
