Terms of Reference 2020/21

Regulatory- general terms:

- The Chair and Vice Chair will be appointed on an annual basis at the Autumn meeting.
- The Committee shall follow the regulations for procedures under the School Governance (Roles, Procedures and Allowances) (England) Regulations 2013 and in particular
- Report to FGB on a termly basis
- The Quorum for this Committee will be 3

Specific terms for this committee:

1. To consider school policy on any matters relating to the school Curriculum, Behaviour Management and Pupil well-being. To recommend new policy and amendments to existing policies to the Governing Body. To ensure that all policies meet the needs of all pupils.
2. To carry out the responsibilities of the governing body with regard to the implementation of the National Curriculum and RE. On behalf of the governing body, to monitor and evaluate the quality of provision and implementation of the National Curriculum and RE and report back to the governing body termly.
3. To ensure that the school fulfils its requirements in relation to statutory assessment and to publish information about school performance as required.
4. To review and evaluate the attainment and progress of pupils across the school, including vulnerable groups.
5. To keep under review and receive regular reports on the quality of teaching
6. To review and evaluate the attendance and behaviour of pupils across the school
7. To receive reports from the Headteacher or other staff member on matters relating to the school Curriculum and/or pupil well-being.
8. To monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the school's engagement with parents and carers including monitoring the views of parents and carers on the curriculum offered by the school and on pupil progress and achievement.
9. To keep under review the extended school offer, including after school clubs. (To be reviewed annually)
10. To consider ways in which home-school links can be further developed and improved and to make appropriate recommendations including the home-school agreement, home learning, the school prospectus and the school website. (To be reviewed annually).
