## Attendance and holidays

Most of our pupils have an excellent rate of attendance at school. Our congratulations to the 13 pupils, who will be receiving certificates at our final assembly on Tuesday, for 100% attendance until today and a further 28 at 99% attendance

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Wirral has one of the lowest school attendance rates in the country. We have been asked to draw to your attention the procedure for issuing Education Penalty Notices for unauthorised absence, which we will follow from September. ## School Meals and Milk

Please may we remind you that school meals are still free for all children in F2, Year 1 and Year 2. For children in Years 3 to 6 the cost will remain at £2.20 per day.

Cash or cheque needs to be in a named envelope and handed to the office.

In the interests of reducing single use plastics, we are no longer providing milk during the morning for children in Years 1 to 6. It will be made available at lunchtime (in a beaker).

## School extension and building works

Some of you may be aware that the Local Authority have agreed to fund an extension programme for our school to improve security, with a new foyer area at the front as well as providing an additional room at the back in the space currently occupied by the bike sheds (which will be moved). We had hoped the works would begin next week, but there has been a delay to the start. This means that the work is likely to take place during the Autumn term.

Once the work begins, the building site areas will be clearly separated off and out of bounds. This will impact on the arrangements for entering and leaving the building. We will clearly signpost the temporary entry and exit points. We will be using the side gate for Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 (F1, F2, Y1 & Y2). Key Stage 2 pupils (Y3-Y6) will be using the gate to the KS1 playground accessed via the car park (which will be closed to traffic at the beginning and end of the school day). It will inevitable cause some disruption for a while. We will post the drawings on our school website, so you can see the plans one we have a confirmed start date.

## Lost property

There is a lot of lost property in the cupboard in the foyer. Please come along and have a look and feel free to help yourself to any unnamed items which are suitable. Anything left at the end of the term will be recycled.

We have decided to wait until the beginning of the new school year before sending out new Privacy Notices for families along with a new consent form to reflect the changes in legislation.
