#### Dear Families,

#### School End of Key Stage Results 2019

We are very proud to have again achieved excellent results in all of the national assessments for 2019 - from the end of Foundation Stage, Year 1 Phonics, End of Key Stage 1 and End of Key Stage 2 assessments. All of our results are above the national averages and even higher than for last year—again amongst the highest in Wirral. Reading together and talking with your child about their learning are shown to provide huge benefits. #### Attendance and Punctuality

Thank you to all who have supported us to improve rates of attendance and punctuality at school over the past twelve months. We want all of our pupils to enjoy coming to school and achieving well so please let staff know if anything is preventing this at home or in school. We are committed to working together with you to resolve any issues that arise.

Please keep your child off school & inform the School Office by 9am if they have sickness, an upset tummy or a high temperature. It is fine to bring them in if they have no obvious symptoms and you are unsure. If your child becomes unwell at school, we will contact you and let you know. If a child has been sick or had an upset tummy, it is essential they remain absent for 48 hours after the last bout of illness.

May we remind you that schools are not permitted to authorise term time holiday absence apart from in the most exceptional circumstances and that approval from the Headteacher should be sought **prior to booking**. Schools are required to record and report instances of unauthorised absence as it is a legal requirement that children of statutory school age attend regularly. Please be advised that Wirral Borough Council may issue a fixed penalty notice with a fine for unauthorised absence.

We will let you know if we have concerns about your child's attendance or punctuality to discuss how we might support you to improve this. Please be aware that it is a legal requirement for parents/ cares to ensure their children attend school regularly and that legal action may be taken in cases of unauthorised absence.
