PE Days...

Staying Active...

Friday 19th March is Red Nose Day. The children will be taking part in fun and active sporting activities. The children need to come dressed in PE clothes and trainers for the day.

Friday 26th March will be our Easter Bunny Dash; this will be similar to our Santa Dash that we held in December. However, this time it will be the exchange of a large egg, not a Christmas present! The children will need to come dressed in PE clothes and trainers for the day.

Free Rapid Lateral Flow Test Kits...

Earlier in the week we shared information with you about ordering free rapid flow test kits. We were informed by Wirral Local Authority that if you wish, you can order kits to test your household, childcare bubble or support bubble if at least one member is a school or college pupil or works in a school or college. As a school we have no expectation that households have to participate in this. There are no requirements that primary school children need to test. If this is something you wish to explore further, the kits can be collected from a testing centre or sent to your home.

Infectious Period Definition...

Within the Wirral Authority we have been following the Public Health England North West definition of infectious period, which used the marker of 48 hours. Public Health England North West has recently confirmed that they need to alter this definition to be in line with National Public Health England. Therefore, the definition is now as follows:

A person is thought to be infectious from 2 days before symptoms appear and up to 10 days after they start displaying symptoms. The onset of infectious period is counted from the morning of the 2 days before the onset of symptoms and not 48 hours from the time of onset of symptoms. For example, a person who developed symptoms at 2pm on the 15th November would be asked to identify contacts from the morning of the 13th November onwards.

If we are informed of any positive cases within school, we will be adhering to this in order to identify any close contacts.

Census 2021...

The next Census is taking place on Sunday 21st March. The Census is a survey that happens every 10 years and gives us a picture of all the people and households in England and Wales. This helps to plan and fund public services within different areas. By taking part in the Census it can support the local community to get the services it needs. The children will be taking part in

some Census 2021 activities on Thursday 18th March to learn more about it. Hopefully, they will be able to tell you what it is all about ready to complete your information on Sunday 21st March. https://census.gov.uk/ https://census.gov.uk/
