At times we have been unsure about the behaviour management system (traffic light chart) - it seems to work well for children who are generally well-behaved, but it is very easy for a more impulsive child to slip into the red, even if the majority of their day has been excellent. Positive praise - gold star, badge, stickers etc. Much more effective with younger children especially.

Could really do with a sports field and more learning based activities outside. School newsletter is helpful and really good. Would like to keep this in paper format rather than just email. There is a lack of feedback from staff generally which is important at this age (eating, library club, had to ask for catch up when he first started among other things).

Overall really good school caring and supportive. My child really enjoys school! Thank you to all the teachers and support.

The school has a lovely friendly and relaxed feel to it and the staff are always very welcoming and extremely approachable.

Each teacher & TA are able to talk in detail about any area of my children's educational goals, current progress and the next steps. Our girls are happy, confident and learning very well at West Kirby Primary.

One of the reasons I chose this school for my child was because they didn't use the traffic light system to manage inappropriate behaviour so was very disappointed when it was introduced. I strongly disagree with the public punishment of children which is quite often based on the say so of another child who are not always truthful. I understand that bad behaviour should have consequences, however I believe that this system causes anxiety and humiliation which has a significant effect on confidence especially to those children who are not "naughty" but socially awkward or simply misunderstood.

Homework is sometimes too much; young children learn better through play.

Would have liked to have been asked how we felt about the change in uniform. I strongly disagree to the change as three generations of family have attended the school wearing the grey uniform. Maybe putting the uniform change to a vote would have been better. I also feel my child doesn't eat enough at lunch time.

We have been very pleased with the teaching in Class 3 this year. My boy has been sufficiently challenged and made excellent progress. The school provides a happy and safe environment for my child and I rarely hear of any incidents in the playground, they all seem to get along no matter what age or class they are in.

Would have liked to be consulted about uniform change.

I would like more structure in general learning I. E. Times tables test every week to ensure a good grounding of the basics. I would also like my child to have an official reading book scheme where he can learn more advanced vocab within a structured setting. Two weeks every Christmas spent rehearsing concert in church. This is at the expense of maths and literacy and is unacceptable. One afternoon is more than enough to rehearse for any concert.

My 'disagree' ratings on Q9 and Q32 come from the school's decision to think it is acceptable to put my child in a mixed (year 5 and year 6) class with 2 teachers who job share. This has hindered progress, reduced confidence (and especially bearing in mind the extra requirements in the new curriculum) and has definitely had a negative effect in this key year leading up to 11 plus. If you must have a mixed class then don't have two mixed class taught by job share teaching. This puts unnecessary stress on pupils and teachers.
