Dear Families,

Following on from the Parent Survey reported in our December newsletter, our School Councillors (elected by their class mates) adapted the questions to create a Pupil Survey for all pupils in Years 3-Year 6. The children decided to undertake class surveys for pupils in Year 1 and Year 2 and some of the older School Councillors went into the classes to help the younger members ask their two questions, with staff helping to write down the responses. The children want to help us continue to improve and develop our school.

You can see a summary of responses on p2. School Councillors have been looking at these to decide what actions or changes might be needed. They will report back to the school and to Governors this will be included in our next newsletter.

Safety on line

Some parents have asked for us to include internet safety updates. At school, our filter system alerts us to any inappropriate searches made . Since September, we have had 2 incidents in school of pupils having their searches blocked . We spoke to those pupils about the dangers & informed their parents. We are also aware of problems with some older children using an app called TikTok and would advise following the link: <u>https://www.commonsensemedia.org/blog/parents-</u><u>ultimate-guide-to-tiktok</u> which says:-

Tik Tok is rated 12+ on the Apple app store and "teen maturity" on Google Play. However, there is no system in place to verify a user's age, so anyone can download it. Because of the access to inappropriate content, and the use of popular music that may contain explicit language, this is not an app for young kids. How safe is TikTok? Using any social network can be risky, but it's possible for kids to safely use the app with adult supervision (and a private account). When you sign up for TikTok, your account is public by default, meaning anyone can see your videos, send you direct messages, and use your location information.
