Dear Parents & Carers,

Welcome back to the final term of this academic year; the summer term. Hopefully, we will see the weather improve as we move into May. I hope that you all had an enjoyable Easter Break and you were able to spend some time together. Thank you to those of you who attended Mr O' Rourke's Multisport Camp. I heard it was another very successful week.

A warm welcome to several new families who have joined West Kirby Primary School this week. We hope that the children have had an enjoyable first week and you have begun to meet other members of our school community.

School places for 2024 have been allocated and shared with families this week. We are looking forward to our F1 children moving into F2 and new families joining us from within the local community. Further information about F2 transition events for new families will be shared as soon as we have finalised everything.

The current Year 6 transition day for our oldest children who are moving onto Secondary Education is due to take place on Wednesday 3rd July. Secondary Schools will provide further details about this nearer the time



As you returned back to school on Monday morning, you will have noticed that we have had some work carried out over the Easter Break. We have removed some of the wooden planters/seating areas as it was rotting in many places and becoming unsafe. We have removed some of the old benches as these were damaged and unsafe in places. In addition, the wall has been removed so that we could open the area up to create more space and improve supervision when the children are on the playground. When the

children have been outside on the playground this week, there has been much more space for them to use and play in, which was our aim. A few of you have asked about what the plans are. Our first aim was to remove some of the structures and create more space, which we have done. We would really like to tarmac the area outside Class 3/4 and where the wooden structures were, but this comes at a considerable cost – we are working on this. We would also like to purchase new, round wooden tables for the children to sit on outside Class 3/4 and Class 4. As we get used to the space and see how it works, we can then think about what next. Many of the children have commented positively about the changes, which is brilliant!

I would like to share some lovely news with you. Over the Easter Break Miss O'Toole had a very special day, her wedding day. She has been busy planning her special day for some time and she had an amazing day. Miss O'Toole's new name is Mrs McNerlin, but for now, and to avoid confusion with the children in EYFS, she is still using her maiden name. Miss O'Toole will start using her new name (Mrs McNerlin) from September 2024.

We have also reviewed how we dismiss the children from WAVES and after school clubs at 4:20pm. This is to ensure the safety of all children at all times. It is possible that it may take a little bit longer to dismiss the children and we ask you to support us with this.

Please can I remind you that children in F1 – Year 4 should not be left unaccompanied on the school playground before the whistle goes at 8:40am. A Year 5 or Year 6 child who walks to school on their own, should not be responsible for a younger child on the playground between 8:30am and 8:40am. Spaces are available in WAVES and can be booked in advance through the school office.

Online Safety

Please also find attached to this email, our latest edition of our Online Safety Newsletter. In the April edition, you can find information about Cyber Bullying, Tik Tok, Online Challenges and a game called Poppy Playtime that may be unsuitable for children to view.



This week we have been made aware of unsuitable posts on What's App groups, which some WKPS children are members of. The Whats App legal age has been reduced recently; however, the minimum age to register and use Whats App is 13, which is secondary school age, not primary.

Health & Safety - Earrings

We have noticed that quite a few children have had their ears pierced over the Easter break. Our WKPS Uniform Policy states that these need to be covered with tape during PE lessons. This is for Health and Safety Reasons. Please also note that staff are not permitted to remove earrings. If the children are unable to remove their earrings due to them being recently pierced and still healing, they need to be able to cover their own earrings with their own tape.
