### This Week...

There have been lots of exciting learning and events going on in school this week...

- EYFS have been learning about bees, making honey biscuits and watching their butterflies emerge from their chrysalids.
- Key Stage One have been designing their own West Kirby murals in Art with each class focusing on a different area in our local community.

## Covid Restrictions...

In recent weeks there have been some local and national restrictions removed. However, many of our Covid safety procedures are currently in place and we ask that you please adhere to these.

- Staggered start and finish times please avoid bringing your child/children to school before their official bubble start time. Children arriving before their start time is limited to parents who have children in different phases (e.g., a child in UKS2 and a child in EYFS) and/or parents who have to get to work and do not have the option of using WAVES due to the restricted number guidance. However, we do have a few spaces available in WAVES so if you need to regularly drop off before the bubble start times. Please ask at the school office for availability.
- Face coverings must still be worn on the playground at all times.
- Social distancing must be adhered to, please avoid waiting in the playground for younger siblings. All children can stay in the classroom until the last bubble time (3:30pm) if needed.
- One adult per household to collect children.

Thank you for your continued support to ensure that our school community stays as safe as possible.

## Test and Trace...

Schools continue to play an important role in contact tracing and the national effort to limit the spread of Coronavirus (COVID-19). Contact tracing support is a key part of the test and trace process and schools hold the data about close contacts and pupil contact details. Therefore, schools are being asked to continue with

contact tracing over half term, similar to the arrangements that were in place over other recent school holidays.

Guidance from the Department for Education states that if a pupil or staff member tests positive for Covid-19 having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation. This is because the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.

Therefore, as school closes on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> May we are asking that you make contact with us if your child develops symptoms between finishing school on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> May and Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> May. If this is the case, we will need to notify their close contacts if the Covid-19 test result comes back positive. If your child develops symptoms **after Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> May, we do not need to** be contacted and you should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace. If your child needs to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case during the holidays, we do not need to be informed about this until Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> June.

### Attendance...

Regular attendance is central to raising standards in education. Regular attendance at school enables children to gain maximum benefit from the range of educational and wider opportunities available to them. Children who are absent from school or who are persistently late can soon fall behind with their learning. Regular and punctual attendance at school is a legal requirement. Children are classified as 'persistently absent' if they miss 10% or more of school due to authorised and/or unauthorised absence. Therefore, attendance of **90% or under is a concern.** We have monitoring systems in place to identify children who are at risk of falling into this category and will involve parents/carers in formulating specific plans to prevent deterioration and to build back attendance levels.
