English

- The Day The Ocean Went Away – Sam Haynes
- Alba the One Hundred Year Old Fish and Something Fishy – Adventure stories using different media to inspire writing.
- Coast to Country poetry – apply growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes to play with words.
-Read their poetry out loud with suitable intonation, volume, tone and action.
- Coast to Country booklet – Use organisational devices to help promote the wonders of West Kirby.
- Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar – Multi clause sentences, conjunctions, speech, apostrophes, powerful verb + adverb pairs and understanding the present perfect form.

Maths

- Times Tables & Division facts – rapid recall
- Written Methods for all four operations
- Compare units of measure for including conversions and decimals (length, capacity)
- Measures – measuring capacity (ml and l) measuring weight (kg, g, mg)
- Graphs to show water usage over a week including rounding and statistics questions.
- Collect data and use graphs to represent their findings.
- Geometry – Compass points, turn, position and direction.

Art

- Sand sculptures linked to work by Andy Goldsworthy
- Create an ink and watercolour painting of the skyline of West Kirby
- Sketching the local wildlife and plants, including observational drawings of plants growing on the beach in West Kirby.

RE – Judaism part 2

- To learn about special Jewish festivals.
- To explain what the Torah is and demonstrate how a Yad is used.
- To recognise Jewish symbols and write definitions for each.
- Design a Hamsa.

Geography – Coast to Country

- Use maps, atlases, globes and digital / computer mapping to find out information and locate key places including West Kirby.
- Use the eight points of a compass and Ordnance Survey maps to find key places/ landmarks.
- Name and locate famous coastal resorts in the UK and around the world
- What is a peninsular? What is an estuary?
- Build on our understanding of coastal features and how they are formed.
- Develop of understanding of how erosion occurs.
- What measures do humans take to prevent coastal erosion?
- Why is flooding a threat? How can it be prevented?
- Understanding the tides at West Kirby.
- How do coastlines and beaches differ?

Science : Living Things and their Habitats.

- What are the seven life processes? MRS GREN
- Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways
- Look at animal habitats and adaptation. What factors impact upon eco-systems?
- Explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name living things in the local and wider environment.
- Recognise that environments can change and this can pose dangers to living things.
- Construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey.
- What wildlife / habitats are apparent in and around West Kirby? Compare and contrast with another region.

Investigative skills: planning, making observations, measuring results and repeating results if necessary, analysing and evaluating results.

Music

Listen and appraise the structure of songs from Wirral based bands : OMD, The Coral and Clean Bandit.
Sign to the song 'Blackbird' by the Beatles as inspiration to create a song about birds found on the Wirral.
Understand the 3-part harmony for the chorus of Blackbird and be aware of the civil rights message.
Create rhythmic notations for creatures found on the local beaches creating a class rap on how to protect them.
