The feedback from the children was positive.</p> <p>The Sailing Centre came to visit our school and delivered an assembly to the KS2 children. The staff talked about the clubs, opportunities and events that take place at the Sailing Centre, in particular over the summer months. This promoted interest from some children and they attended Water Sports out of school hours e.g. SPLASH Club.</p> <p>We also organised a Year 4, 5 and 6 after school Water Sports Club. This was very popular and all places were filled, including some Pupil Premium children. We hope to continue our links with The Sailing Centre.</p>	<p>Excellent and engaging assembly from The Wirral Sailing Staff.</p> <p>Year 5 Water Sports Day enjoyed by pupils – pupil voice and staff voice</p> <p>Children talked about the clubs that they had taken part in at The Sailing Club after we signposted them to what was available.</p> <p>School Water Sports Club – all places were filled and demand was high. Pupils reported back that they had a great time and experienced different Water Sports during the 5 weeks.</p> <p>Excellent reports back from The Sailing Staff at the end of the 5 weeks.</p> <p>Some of our Year 6 children have gone on to take part in national windsurfing competitions after discovering a keen interest.</p>
