As many of you know, our Caretaker, Mr Houghton, will be leaving West Kirby Primary School in the coming weeks. Mr Houghton has worked at our school for 11 years and is always on hand to complete many jobs around our school. He helps to keep the building safe, well maintained and clean. We are very lucky that Mr Houghton is also very skilled and can make many items, one of his most recent creations was the EYFS Music Wall. Mr Houghton is a regular face that you see at the gate each morning and he will be missed at our school. His last working day at WKPS will be Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November. I am sure you will join me in wishing Mr Houghton our best wishes as he approaches his last few weeks at WKPS.

We have successfully recruited a new Caretaker, who will start our school on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November. His name is Mr Baines and I am sure he will soon become a familiar face to you all.

I would also like to share information with you about another very familiar face at our school — Library Jane. For just over 12 months, Jane has been battling with Hairy Cell Leukaemia. Despite this diagnosis she has continued to put reading and our school library at the heart of everything she does. There have been days when Library Jane has been unable to come into school, but she has continued at home to contact authors/poets, seek out new books and write her fortnightly Reading Sways. Jane has commenced treatment for Hairy Cell Leukaemia this week and will therefore be absent from school for an extended period of time. We are keeping in touch with Jane and we are sending her our very best wishes, which I am sure you will also share with me. We are working hard behind the scenes to ensure the smooth running of the library, continuation of reading newsletters and other reading events. Please bear with us if this takes us some time, or we miss something.

#### **EYFS Outdoor Area**

Unfortunately, we did have a sad start to the new half term when we were informed that a small number of children/teenagers had entered our playground and outdoor EYFS area on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> October, and had caused damage and destruction. Our local neighbours reported this to the police, who have been in touch with school. Mr Houghton and the EYFS team worked hard on Monday to check the area, tidy the area and fix items that had been broken. We are very lucky that the damage was not extensive. No damage was made to our school building and the intruders did not gain any access into school. We became aware that our older children were aware of these events so we have spoken to Year 5 and Year 6 about this event, and hope that we have reassured them.

As a community school, if you do ever see anything happening on our property in the evenings, at the weekend or in the school holidays and you can report it to the police – please do. Hopefully, this will be a one-off situation. Thank you for the kindness that has been shown by our school community in asking if we need to replace anything. The main things are new fresh play sand for the EYFS sandpit, new traffic cones and we would like to purchase an outdoor/wooden lockable storage cupboard that we can keep some of the items in.

#### **Christmas Reading Event**

Following our successful Christmas Reading Event last year, we are holding another similar event and hoping to build on the success from last year. As always, our aim is to promote the love of reading and it may also give some Christmas list book ideas. This year there will be an EYFS & KS1 Christmas Reading Event and a KS2 Reading Event.

#### **Mental Health Support Team (MHST)**

The MHST support have been working in our school for a few years, this is following national funding for all schools to be able to support children who may need it. Our Mental Health Practitioner is called Jessy and she has successfully worked with a number of our families.

Jessy works with children and/or families where the children may be experiencing worries, low self-esteem, anxiety and many other different aspects. There is a referral process to this, which is straight forward and nothing to worry about. If you feel this may be useful for your child, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher or myself. Supporting the mental health and wellbeing of all our children is really important to us at WKPS and we have seen the positive work which has emerged following children/families engaging with the MHST team.

Jessy is going to be working alongside WKPS this year to develop the role of wellbeing ambassadors. Key Stage Two have an assembly next Tuesday to learn more about wellbeing ambassadors and will also meet Jessy.

In addition, we are lucky that Jessy is able to offer a Parent/Carer workshop this month on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> November. The focus of this workshop is 'Understanding and supporting my child with worries.' The workshop will take place in the school hall from 9:00-10:00am. Please come along – Parents and Carers are warmly invited. Parenting is not an easy task, and we all look for tips and ideas along the way.
