<b>Democracy</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Democratic process for electing members of the Eco Council.</li><li>• Pupil Voice - interviews and questionnaires to gather opinions of the children in relation to Science at WKPS. Outcomes acted upon, where possible.</li></ul>
<b>Rule of Law</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Discussions about scientists having to follow the laws of our country when they are doing research.</li><li>• Link to the need for 'fair testing' - if you don't follow the rules of 'fair testing' the results cannot be trusted, likewise society needs to follow its rule</li></ul>
<b>Individual Liberty</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Participation in extra-curricular clubs (e.g. Mad Science). The pupils are given the freedom to make choices based on their interest.</li></ul>
<b>Mutual Respect</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Evaluating the work of their peers and giving positive and constructive feedback.</li><li>• Celebration and acknowledgment of British scientists in modern times and throughout history.</li><li>• Working together, in groups, to investigate a scientific concept, allowing all to participate and contribute.</li></ul>
<b>Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Acknowledge that some beliefs have an impact on science (e.g. creationism) and provide the children with a balanced view of both sides of the argument.</li></ul>
