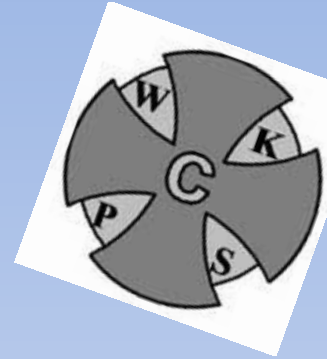
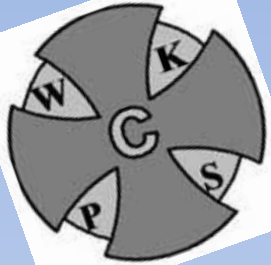

- Global citizenship: At the end of a small peninsula, we understand the importance of links to the world beyond our locality to develop respect for others.

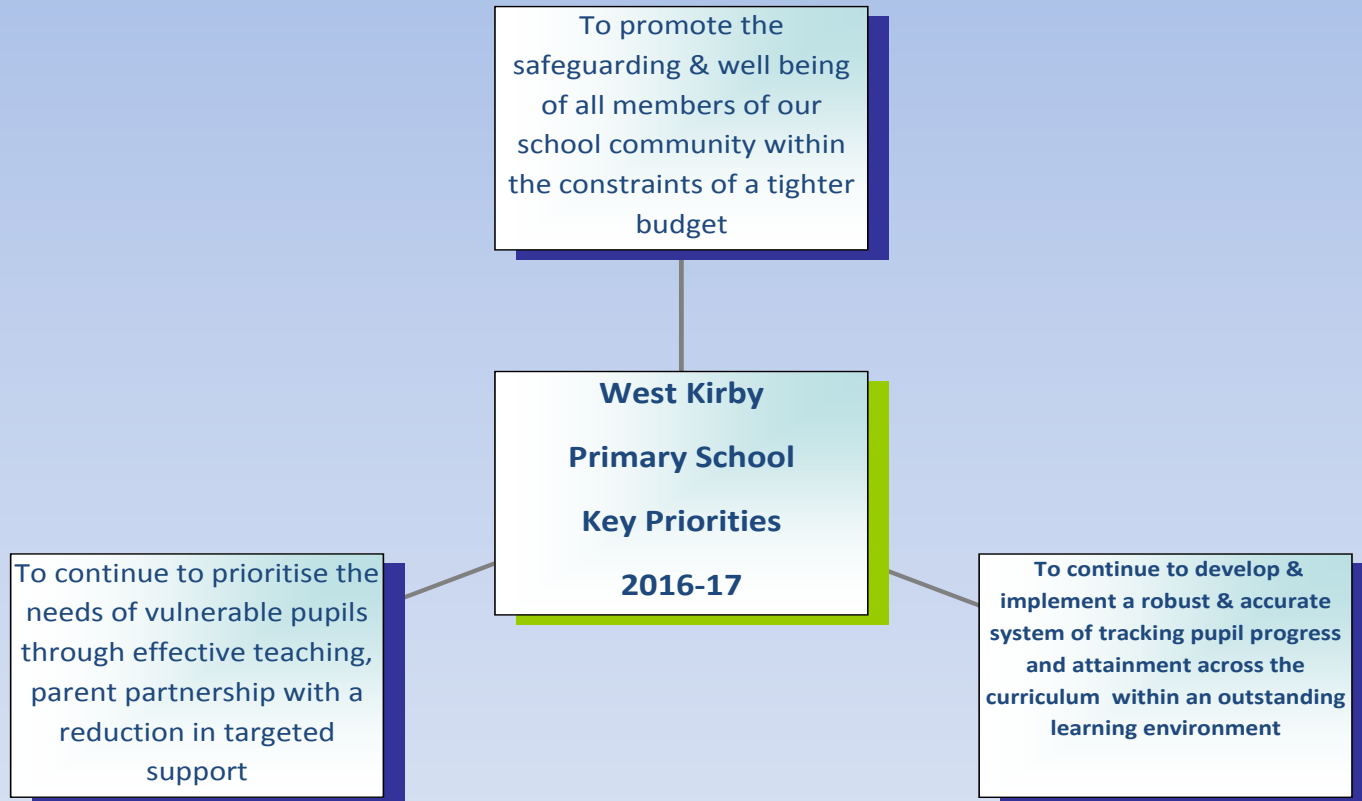
As policies change, we continue to focus on:-
