

British Values in PE



How are British Values promoted through PE at WKPS?

Democracy	 Sports Leaders are all eligible to apply for the roles of Sports Leaders and Playmakers. They are not judged on sporting ability alone, but on a range of qualities such as leadership and organisational skills. Pupil Voice allows pupils to express opinions in relation to PE at WKPS, through interviews and an online questionnaire.
Rule of Law	 Thinking skills, one of the 3 strands that form the basis of a good PE lesson, are developed and discussed when reflecting on own performance and those of others. Sportsmanship and fair play are seen as being an essential component, when assessing a pupil in their behaviours in PE, not just their physical ability. Play Leaders and Sports Leaders model the rules and expectations of games, when supporting younger pupils.
Individual Liberty	 Pupils can make their own choices when selecting extra -curricular clubs. A wide range of clubs before and after school, such as fencing, athletics, team games and dance provide a variety of options. Pupils are involved in charitable work, raising money through Sports Relief, for others in the community, who are less fortunate than they are.
Mutual Respect	 Pupils are encouraged to evaluate their own performance and the performance of others. This encouragement begins with our very youngest pupils, in its' simplest form, before developing into a more detailed evaluation, using the vocabulary associated with that particular sport. The older pupils are encouraged to suggest ways in which they can adapt a game or skill in order to make it assessable for all. This enables all to participate.
Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs	 Diversity and equality in sport is at the forefront of educating pupils to show tolerance to others. Pupils will learn about sporting heroes such as: Marcus Rashford - supports foodbanks and school meals. Promotes racial equality. Show Racism The Red Card. Sarah Storey in disability sport – cycling and swimming medallist Mo Salah – a Muslim footballer, who respects Ramadan, whilst continuing to play matches Josh Cavallo – Australian soccer player – first player in top flight professional soccer, to publicly come out as gay.
