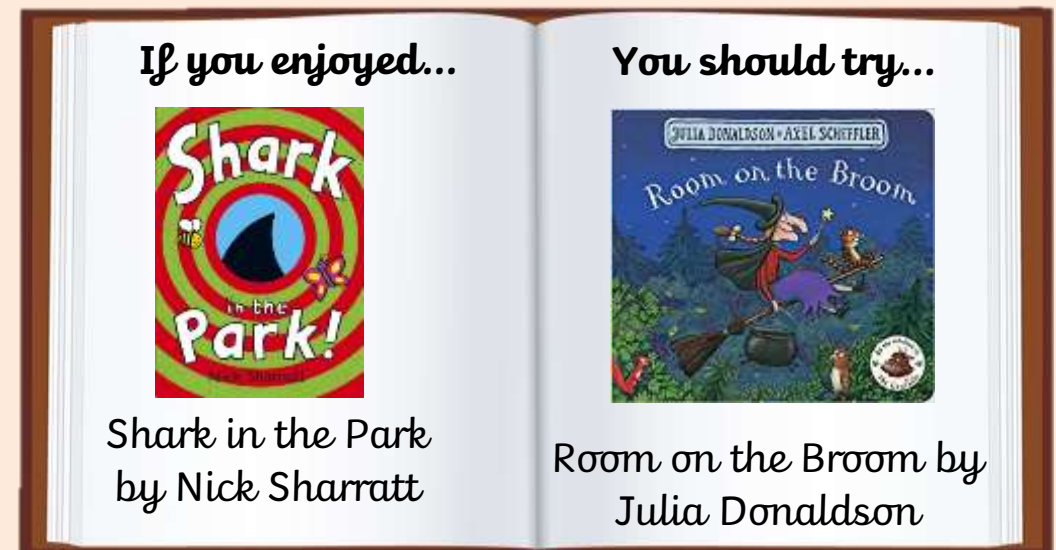

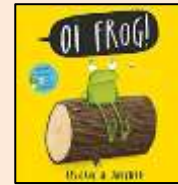
Izzy Gizmo – Pip Jones

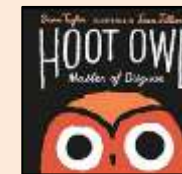
Gigantasaurus – Jonny Duddle
